// Message Summary

Pastor Jesse DeYoung discussed 2 examples of innovative processes that changed the culture. In the case of the Roman roads, it allowed the Roman Empire to move troops more quickly across the empire to maintain control. As Jesse pointed out, it also allowed Paul to reach more places more quickly to spread the gospel. In the example of the printing press, it allowed people who had never seen scripture to have their own copy of the Bible and not be dependent on once-a-week readings. We are now living in "The Internet Age". Jesse pointed out that there are three components of taking advantage of technology to spread the gospel.

Courageous Sacrifice: The Apostle Paul listed the times where he sacrificed greatly to further the gospel. Jesus said that it is better to lose a part of your body than to have that part of the body lead you astray. These two teaching together launched us into the changes and sacrifices we will need to make so that the internet does not conquer us.

Spiritual Formation: This is occurring daily whether we want it to or not. Some things we can control are the content and the amount. This transitioned into the Grow Your Faith challenge.

Sharing the Good News: We are all called to share the good news with others. Engaging the internet to help accomplish this seems difficult. Flatirons IT staff have created a process that will make this easier: Share Your Story Challenge.
