(Read out loud)

Rock, Paper, Scissors, Knockout!

(Play this with your group)

We're going to play rock, paper, scissors until one person is left standing. The trick is, we're not playing each other. Everyone is playing against me...kind of.

Everyone in our group will play at the same time. If you match what I throw, then you will be eliminated. We'll keep doing this until there's one person left who hasn't matched me!

We will go on Rock-Paper-Scissors-Shoot.

(Discuss with your group)

In your own words, define what "vital" means.

The Church Is...

(Discuss with your group)

In Romans, Paul writes "...so it is with Christ's body. We are many parts of one body, and we all belong to each other."

In 1 Corinthians he wrote "All of you together are Christ's body, and each of you is a part of it."

We are the Church. Empowered by the Spirit of the Lord and washed by the blood of Christ, we make up the body; the bride of Christ. The Church is a body of believers led by God's will to do good in our own individual and unique ways.

(Discuss with your group)

How would your life look different if you really believed that the Church was vital to life?

One Word Story

(Play this with your group)

We are going to tell a story. Not just any story, a one-word-at-a-time story.

Here's how it works:

We will establish an order in which our group will tell the story, but remember it can only be one word at a time. I am going to choose one person to write down every word we say so we can read it back once we've finished the story.

A Collection

(Read out loud)

It's crazy to think that we have the ability to read the Bible on our phones when all the early Church had was a collection of stories shared through word of mouth or read from different letters for generations.

Stories are a powerful tool in our world. The Good News of Jesus' death for our sins and resurrection was and is still told as a story; a story that the entire purpose of the Church is built on.

The Challenge

(Read out loud)

Here is your *Church Is Vital* Challenge! You will receive a card with three questions and a blank space for a fourth on it. Your challenge is to take this card and have a conversation with someone who goes to church (it doesn't have to be your church).

Ask them the three questions and write in a question of your own in the blank space! You have from now until the next time we meet together to have a conversation and hear the story of why the Church is vital in their lives!

What's To Come

(Pray with your group)

Pray for the people you are going to have a conversation with.

Pray for the conversations that you are going to have.

Pray for each other to complete the challenge, no matter how awkward it could be.

The small group leader will pray to close.
