// Community Question

Exposure to other cultures can challenge us to reflect on what we think is important. The central priorities of the Massai are brotherhood ("we" not "I" mentality) and their faith in the provisions of God despite not being wealthy by our standards. What could we learn from the Massai way of life in how we approach ours?

// Discussion Questions

- 1. Out of the three responses to frustration with the world, (angry, walk away, lose hope) which one do we resonate with? Why?
- 2. Read Matthew 5:14-16. Christ says we are the light of the world. How can we bring the light of Christ into situations that make us angry, give up, or lose hope?
- 3. Similarly, Matthew says we have the light of Christ in us, what if we asked Christ into our pain? What difference do you think it would make?
- 4. Read Philippians **2:3-11** This passage describes how Jesus left heaven and jumped into the middle of our mess and paid the ultimate price to rescue us. What would it look like for us to let our light shine before people so they see what is possible and turn to Jesus to be saved?
- 5. Jim cast vision for the future of Flatirons to help plant other "Flatirons-like" churches all around the United States, and even other parts of the world. He encouraged us to consider how we may get involved with that vision to reach out, to give to, and maybe even move to Phoenix to partner with our first Church planters. What's one thing you or your group can do to support this vision?
