

## Church Gone Wild – House Party

Weekend Discussion Questions

October 4-5, 2014

### Community:

1. Have you ever lived by the motto “If it makes you happy do it, if it doesn’t, don’t?” What did you do?

### Core:

1. Take a few minutes to recap what we talked about last week.
2. Scott said that the church at Corinth was a “church gone wild.” What do you think this means?
3. In Paul’s letter to the Corinthians, he had a lot of hard truth to deliver but he lead with grace and delivered his truth through grace. How can we do this when we have some hard truth to deliver to someone?
4. Scott said, “A good father comes alongside his children and points them to a better way, helps them walk in that better way and cheers them on as they do it and corrects and disciplines them when they don’t.” How has God done this in your life?
5. How easy is it to “gravitate” towards someone that you look up to? Have you ever done this and then realized you needed to refocus towards Jesus?
6. What do you think Paul means when he talks about “the wisdom of the world?”
7. The people at Corinth held on to what society around them told them was important. How do we do that? What do you hold onto that society says is important yet God says isn’t important?
8. We all come to a point where we perceive that on our own we are not enough. How have you tried to fill that void when you didn’t fill it with Christ?
9. How does the truth that “God chose you” change the way that you find your identity?

### Challenge:

1. Think back to the desperation you had before finding Jesus. How has your view on grace changed since then?
2. Paul wasn’t about winning arguments; he was about winning people and showing people who Jesus is. How can your actions be like Paul’s and focused on showing people who Jesus is instead of winning an argument about Jesus? What do you need to change to show people who Jesus is through grace?
3. Take some time to pray for the people you have the opportunity to show Jesus to. Pray for each other to lead with grace and to not win arguments but win people.
