Preschool Week 2

PARENT BIBLE STUDY Read: Genesis 1:6-11

Every day we're surrounded by simple, yet profound reminders of God's creation both visible and invisible. We see the glory of a sunrise; a roaring river; a snow-capped mountain, and we can easily think of the splendor of creation, and the majesty of our Creator.

But we can also know the glory of God through his unseen creation. Colossians 1:16 says, "For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him."

God created invisible things like gravity, and the very air we breathe. And while that is impressive, the idea of God making invisible things like the human soul and emotions seems even more profound. Acts 17:25 says, "He himself gives to all mankind life and breath and everything."

Thinking about how personal God is in creating the most intimate parts of us, is different than thinking of him creating the sun. When we realize that our Creator God is not only capable of forming continents with his words, but of forming our hearts to open to his whispers, it changes who we understand God to be. He is magnificent, yet also intimately close; creating and sustaining all things, visible, invisible, massive, and minute.
