# **Grow a Pair – Honorable and Protective**

Weekend Discussion Questions October 16-17, 2010

## **Community:**

1. How has your understanding and definition of manhood changed during the "Grow a Pair" series?

#### Core:

- 1. Piece together and summarize the story of Boaz from the book of Ruth from what you already knew and what Scott talked about.
- 2. Ruth chose to go to Bethlehem with Naomi (Ruth 1:1-5), why do you think she did that?
- 3. Naomi felt afflicted and bitter toward God why did she feel this way and have you ever found yourself in a similar frame of mind?
- 4. Looking back on that time in your life have you been able to see that God did not abandon you but had a plan for you?
- 5. What made Boaz the type of man that other men looked up to?
- 6. How do you become an honorable man? And how do you become a dishonorable man?
- 7. Do you have areas of your life that you are trying to dig yourself out of on the path toward regaining honor?
- 8. In what direction are you heading, toward honor or dishonor? Why?
- 9. "The diminishing return of sin leads to an escalation of risk." How do small compromises along the way make that happen?
- 10. How does Boaz demonstrate honor?
- 11. How does Boaz demonstrate that he is protective?
- 12. Sometimes doing the right thing doesn't work out for your best, but you will have your honor in the end. Have you ever faced situations that worked out that way?
- 13. Do you still have your honor? If so what will it take to keep it and if not how can you get it back?
- 14. Are you protecting what is most important in your life?

Weekend Discussion Questions for Women October 16-17, 2010

# **Community:**

- 1. Who comes to mind when you think of an honorable, male hero?
- 2. When did you feel the most protected and honored as a young girl?

#### Core:

- 1. Read Ruth chapter 1. Based on chapter 1, what kind of person is Ruth?
- 2. Why do you think Ruth chose to stay with her mother-in-law?
- 3. Read Ruth chapter 2. What does it mean to be an honorable man? Does it look differently to be an honorable woman? If so, how?
- 4. Scott used the phrase "diminishing return of sin." What do you understand that phrase to mean? Can you think of an example in your life?
- 5. How does the "diminishing return of sin" lead us further away from being honorable women?
- 6. How would you compare Boaz and his response to Ruth with David's story and his response to his daughter last week?
- 7. Read Psalm 36:7 and Psalm 57:1. The concept of "under wings" is used multiple times. What does the phrase tell us about the nature of God's relationship with us?
- 8. How would you explain the concept of the "kinsman redeemer"?
- 9. What is most surprising to you about Ruth's story?
- 10. Compare the story of Ruth and Boaz with Jesus' arrival in this world as our redeemer.
- 11. Read Matthew 1:5-6. Do you recognize the names of women in the family tree of Jesus who would be considered of "questionable character" today? What does that tell you about God?

### **Challenge:**

- 1. Consider whether you're an honorable woman. What do you need to do to remain honorable? What steps would you need to take to become honorable?
- 2. Consider whether, as a woman, there are people or relationships in your life that you need to protect. Ask God to show you what steps to take to do that.
