PERSONAL QUALIFICATIONS:

MINIMUM PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS:

- Bachelor's degree plus five years of related experience, which includes leading high school students, recruiting and leading volunteers, experience teaching, and/or managing people.
- Demonstrates skilled relational leadership integral to collaborate, influence, and impact High School Ministry at the Lafayette Campus, taking the program to the next level.
- Superior communication skills, written and verbal.
- Experience leading outreach initiatives, cultivating partnerships with local schools and other organizations to develop giving and serving opportunities for the ministry.
- Must be a strategic thinker, self-motivated, with excellent organizational and time management skills.
- Ability to develop, equip, and mobilize volunteers.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Leadership and oversight of all aspects of high school programming (activities, worship, small groups, teaching etc.) at the Lafayette Campus.
- Recruits, trains, schedules, and develops volunteers.
- Takes initiative in building relationships, conducts regular informational/training sessions, and shows appreciation to volunteers.
- Pursues regular contact and builds relationships with students and their parents.
- Manages and maintains the High School Ministry budget.
- Oversees all ministry needs – accounting, email communication with parents, volunteers, and staff, tracking ministry metrics, etc.
- Supports, attends, and assists the overall operation of the Lafayette Campus.
