This primarily means executing student programming each week, but also includes assisting in developing content, developing volunteer leaders and student leaders, assisting with planning and executing camp, and working with Campus staff to accomplish the overall ministry plan for Longmont Campus.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

- The face and voice of Student Ministry at the Longmont Campus – this includes being present and available in the lobbies during weekend services whenever possible, being a go-to resource for parents of students and advocating for effective student ministry at Longmont.
- Develop, lead and supporting adult volunteers in effective ministry to students
- Manage all aspects of student programming (Games, Worship, Small Groups, Teaching etc.)
- Write and deliver messages
- Manage small groups including coaching leaders, writing small group questions etc.
- Oversight and development of student ministry space (set up, tear down, improving the environment, etc.)
- Recruit, train, schedule and develop leaders
- Create and run leader meetings
- Effective school and community outreach to students
- Assist developing the teamwork and culture of your campus team and all campus student teams.
- Support, attend and work at student and campus events
- Plan and manage budget
- Regular and effective parent communication
- Assist in developing overall plan, but specifically the student ministry plan, for Family Ministry (birth – Seniors in High School)
