## SHAPE - PERISH to PROVIDE and PROTECT

Weekend Discussion Questions September 5-6, 2015

## Community:

- 1. Thinking back to last week, have you taken any steps to *assess* and improve your life this past week? Were there areas where you struggled harder to address?
- 2. This week's word is *perish*. When you think of perishing to your wants and desires, what comes to mind immediately?

## Core:

- 1. What aspects of your life make you feel like a boy (or a child)? And what aspects make you feel like a man (or woman)?
- 2. How would you describe the difference between wants and desires, and needs?
- 3. **Read John 10:10**. Jesus says He wants us to have an abundant life. What does that abundant life look like for you? Do you believe that it's possible to live a life like that? Why?
- 4. Jesus lived a life where He *completely* perished yet He was crucified. Can we really relate to that type of sacrifice? Where in life do you need to sacrifice the most?
- 5. **Read 1 Corinthians 13:11**. What are some *childish ways* that you have given up? What are some areas in your life where you are still childish that you need to give up?
- 6. What needs to perish in order for you to become the man (or woman) that the people in your life need you to be?
- 7. "I would die for my family." Jim called BS on that common phrase and asked four hard questions. Discuss each one:
  - a) Are you willing to kill your lust?
  - b) Are you willing to lay down your addiction?
  - c) Are you willing to put to death your selfish ambition?
  - d) Are you willing to crucify your habit of running away from hard things?

## Challenge:

Jim listed the things that *boys* do vs. what *men* do. Take some time this week to do a hard assessment on where you need to grow up.

- Boys Take. Men Give.
- Boys ask, "Is it fun?" Men ask, "How can I help?"
- Boys are "all in" as long as it's entertaining. Men are "all in" until they finish what they started.
- Boys are about self-indulgence. Men are about sacrificial love.
- Boys expect others to provide what they lack. Men look around to see where something is lacking, and provide.
